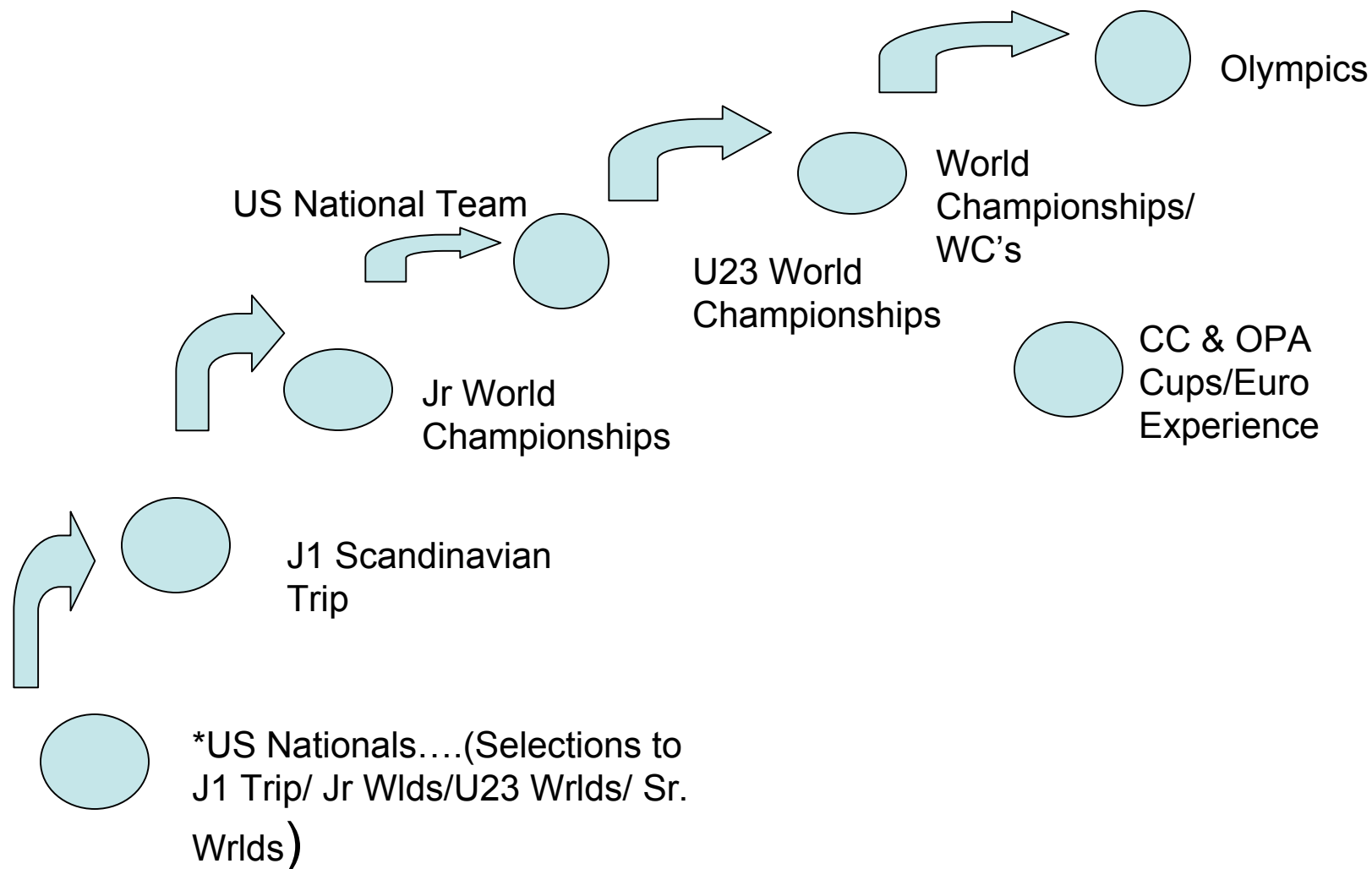

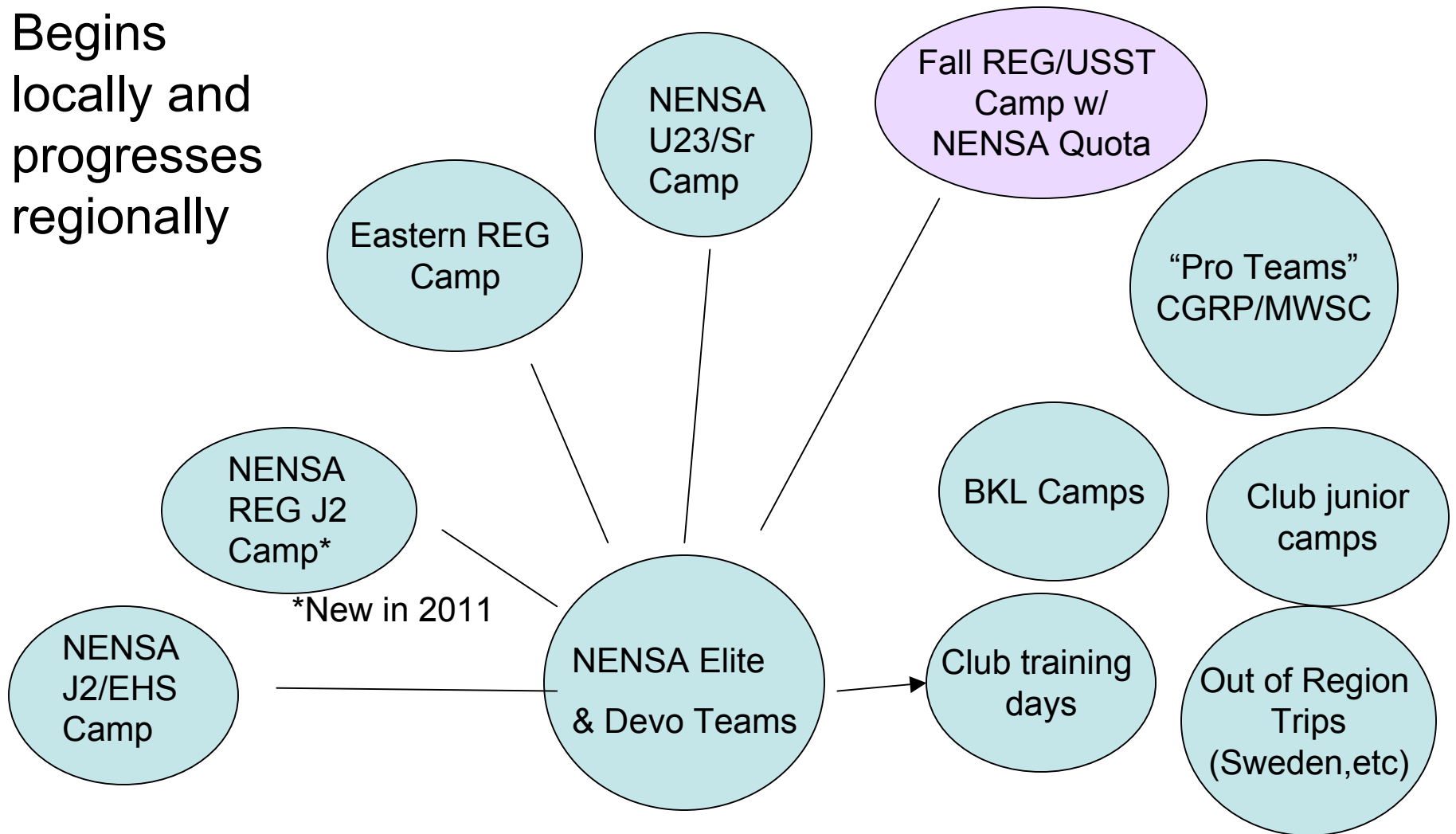

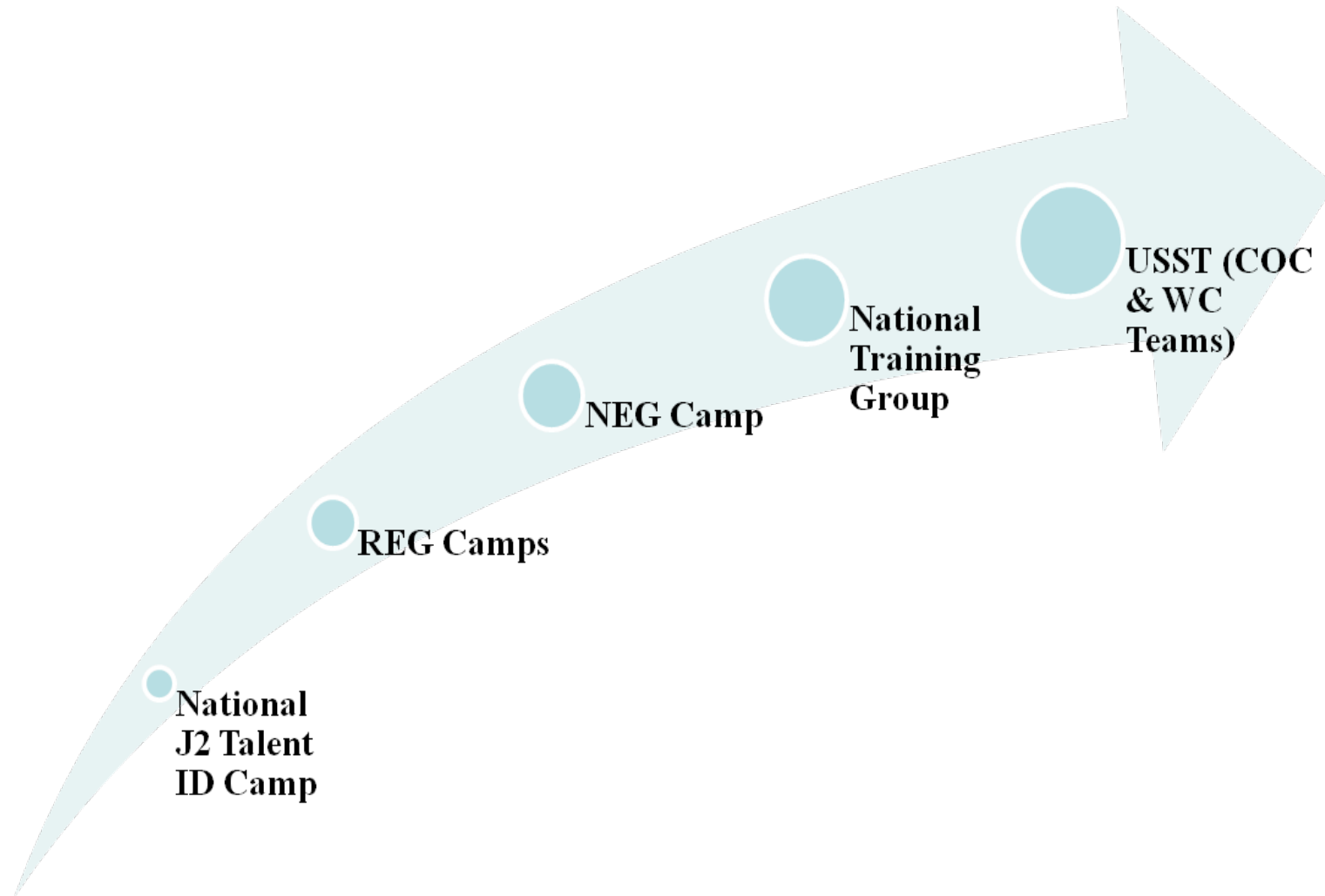


Training/Development Pipeline

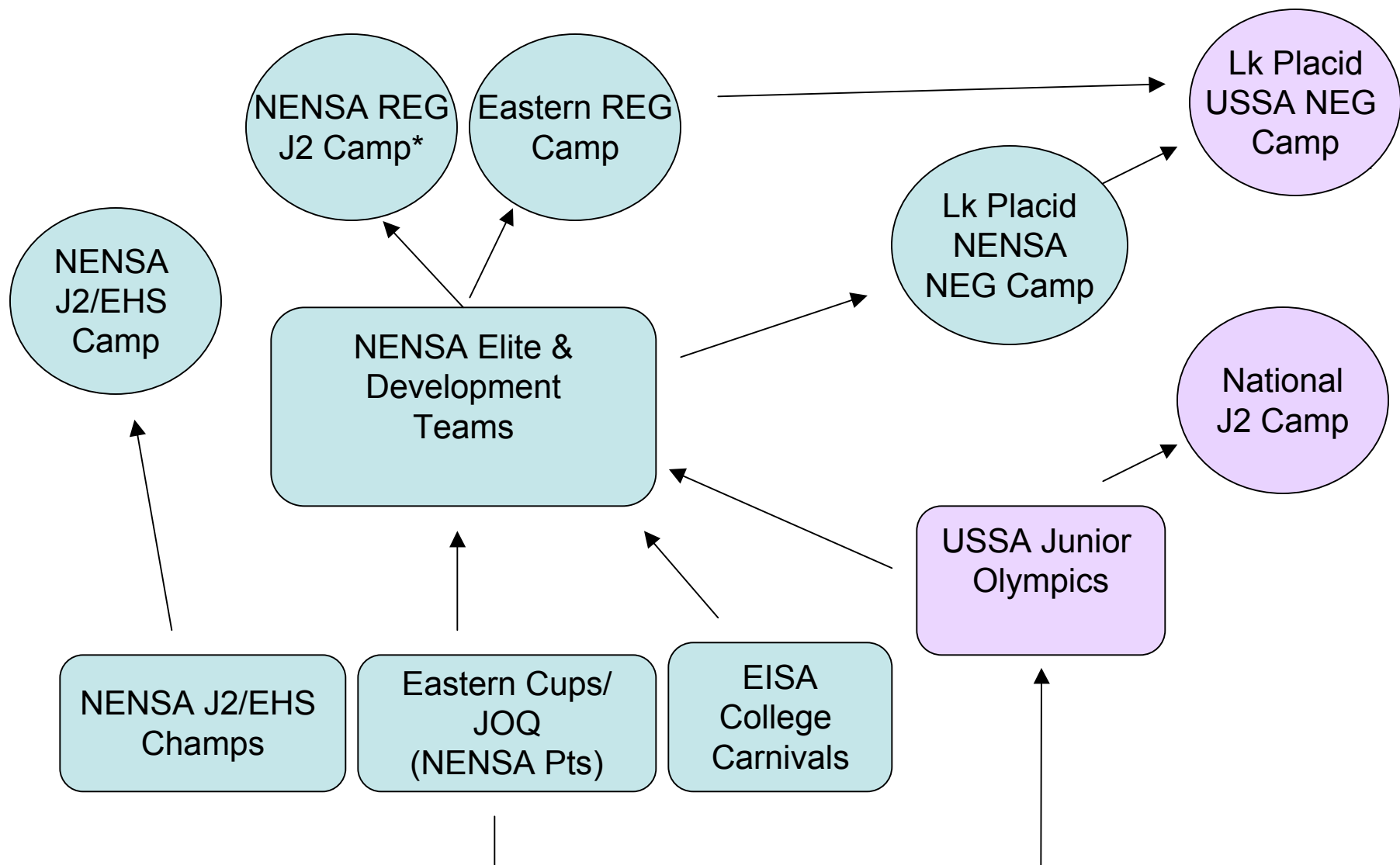

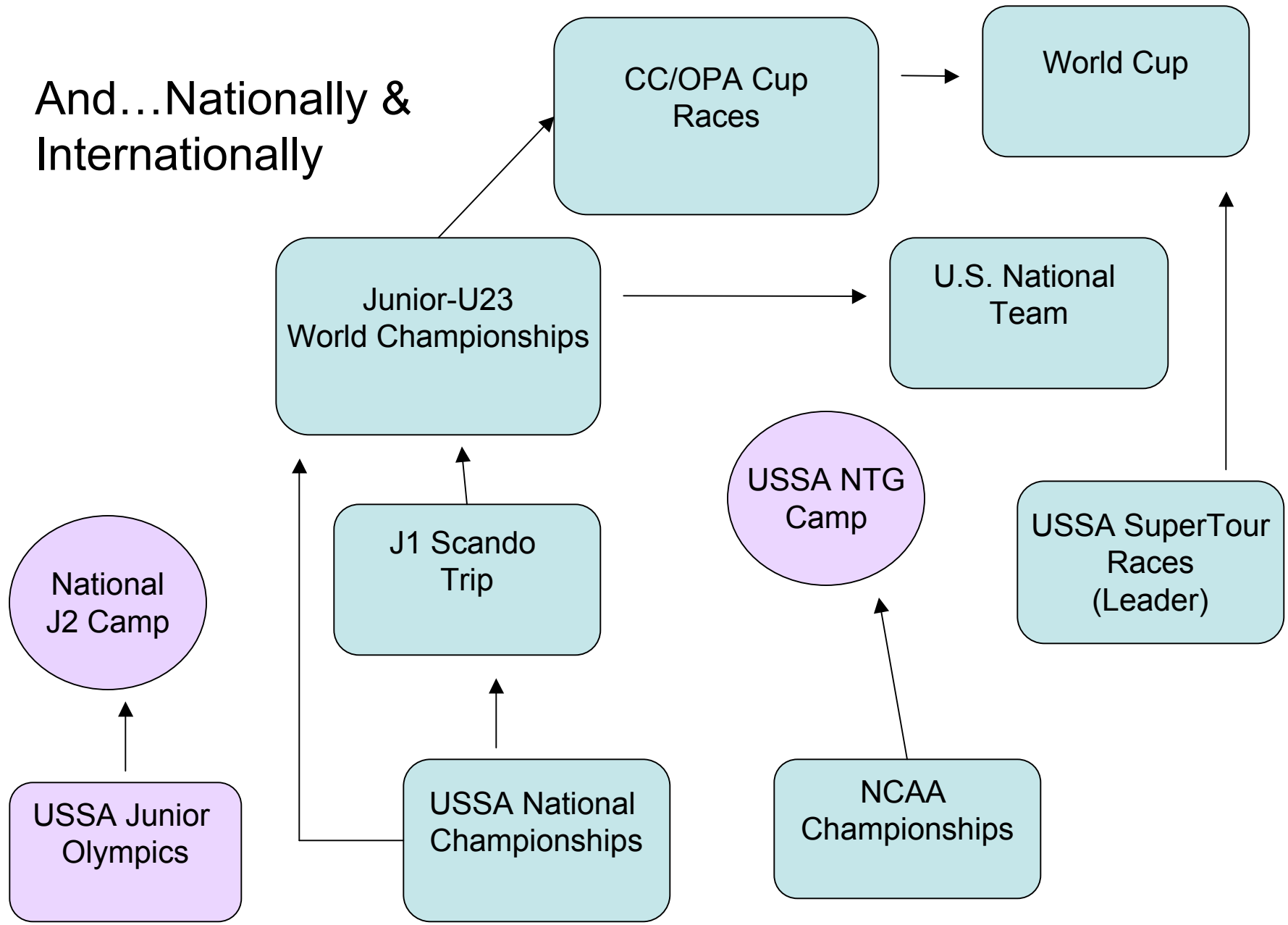
USSA Athlete Development Pipeline

Invitational Camps:

NENSA Elite and Development teams utilize points profiles and race results for team selection- Invitations to NE J2/EHS/REG camps go out to Elite & Devo team members first.

J2/EHS camp...

Invitations are based on previous winter's performances in J2 Champs and Eastern High School Championships.

REG Camps...

Invitations are based on previous winter's performance at JO's, NENSA/FIS/ USSA race results which translates into Elite /Devo team status and Discretion. (Athlete must provide training logs to verify they are maintaining a level of fitness, etc).

USSA National J2 Camp

Invitations are based on performance at last winter's JO's; top 20 in individual events. (New this summer)

NEG camp

NEG Athletes are selected by USSA with regional input, from REG camps with consideration of improvements made from previous summer/winter.

NTG camps

Athletes are selected by USSA, based on outstanding performances from last season, at U.S. Champs, JO's, NCAA's and World Jr / U23-World Championships.
(25 athletes selected/1st yr OJ-1st yr. U23)

Outstanding performances at Wrld Jr /U23 Wrld's could net athlete a spot on a Continental /OPA Cup start line, or a spot on the US National Team .

- Central Europe: Europa Cup (OPA Cup)
- Scandinavia: Scandinavian Cup
- USA: Super Tour
- Canada: Nor Am
- Eastern Europe (Slavic Cup)
- and so on...

•These are the final steps leading to the World Cup level, and in fact will often include world cup skiers that are resting, at home, or are off from the WC for a period.

•From each of these series, the FIS award paid start rights to the World Cup. For instance, the leaders at the end of last season's SuperTour may choose to race the fall world cup.
